

Feline distemper, also known as feline panleukopenia virus (FPV) or feline parvo, is a devastating and sometimes fatal disease that occurs in cats. It has also been called cat fever, cat plague, feline agranulocytosis, and feline infectious enteritis.

FPV is a highly contagious disease spread among cats and found practically everywhere in the environment. Cats are more susceptible to contracting the virus, though, if they are based in communities such as kennels, animal shelters, pet stores, and feral cat communities.

kittens, immunocompromised cats, and unvaccinated cats are at greater risk. They can also be more severely affected.

This disease affects the intestinal lining and white blood cells. While it is life-threatening, cats who survive will become immune to a subsequent infection.

Nandi Charity is 100% volunteer organization. Volunteers are needed to work in furniture store, clothing store and as van drivers for donation retrieval and the delivery of purchased items.
